Vision:


By 2018, the JHMC shall have transformed Camp John Hay into the primary catalyst for the tourism development within the Cordillera Region and the leader of environment

It is understood that the GOCC must achieve a weighted-average of at least 90% to be eligible to grant any Performance-Based Bonus.

- 4. Strategic Initiatives. JHMC hereby commits to undertaking the following key programs and/or projects identified as having a significant impact on its Performance Scorecard (PES Form 2) attached hereto as Annex B, to wit:
 - (a) Strategic Initiative 1 John Hay Special Tourism Economic Zone Expansion to an Information Technology Park (I.T. Park);
 - (b) Strategic Initiative 2 Springs Development Project;
 - (c) Strategic Initiative 3 Barangay Segregation Program (Brgy, Hillside)
 - (d) Strategic Initiative 4 Information Technology (I.T.) Park in Portions of Lot 8 and Lot 2:
 - (e) Strategic Initiative 5 Barangay Segregation Program (Brgy. Dagsian);
 - (f) Strategic Initiative 6 Continuing Compliance to National Ambient Air Quality Standards on TSP and PM10 within the John Hay Special Economic Zone; and
 - (g) Strategic Initiative 7 Events to Augment the revenue Generated from Ticket Sales at the Historical Core.

The Commitment herein includes obtaining all necessary approvals, if applicable, such as those for Major Development Projects under GCG MC No. 2013-03. JHMC shall include updates on the foregoing Strategic Initiatives in its submission of quarterly monitoring reports to the GCG.

- 5. Quarterly Submission of Performance Monitoring. JHMC shall submit a quarterly monitoring report to the GCG within thirty (30) calendar days from the close of each quarter using the monitoring report attached hereto as Annex C.
- 6. Good Governance Conditions. In addition to the covered portions of the Performance Scorecard, the GOCC must fully comply with the Good Governance Conditions enumerated under GCG MC No. 2013-02, namely:
 - Conditions Common to National Government Agencies and GOCCs:

(a) Transparency Seal;

- (b) PhilGEPS Posting;
- (c) Cash Advance Liquidation;
- (d) Citizen's Charter or its equivalent; and
- (e) Compliance with the submission and review requirements covering Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Networth (SALN);¹
- 6.2. Conditions Specific to GOCCs Covered by R.A. No. 10149:
 - (a) Satisfaction of all statutory liabilities, including the payment of all taxes due to the Government, and declaration and payment of all dividends to the State as of the end of the applicable calendar year, whenever applicable. Liabilities that are still under dispute and there has been no final and executory judgment/decision as of the date of the release of the PBB by the GOCC shall be excluded for the purpose of this provision.
 - (b) Submission and execution of concrete and time bound action plans for addressing Notices of Disallowances and Audit Observation Memoranda from the Commission on Audit (COA), if any.
 - (c) Adoption of a "Manual of Corporate Governance" pursuant to Section 42 of the CODE OF CORPORATE GOVERNANCE FOR GOCCs (GCG MC No. 2012-07) that is approved by GCG and uploaded on the GOCC's website.
 - (d) Compliance with posting on the GOCC's website the information enumerated under Section 43 of GCG MC No. 2012-07.
 - (e) Adoption of a No GIFT POLICY approved by the GCG and uploaded on the GOCC's website pursuant to Section 29 of GCG MC No. 2012-07.
- 7. JHMC hereby undertakes to have its Performance Scorecard rated by its customers and solicit feedback on how the same may be improved. JHMC shall determine the most effective method for accomplishing the said purpose. Such information shall be reported to GCG together with the quarterly monitoring report. The rating shall not affect the performance indicators/measures in JHMC's Performance Scorecard, and shall be used solely as a reference by GCG and JHMC during Performance Agreement Negotiations/Renegotiations.
- 8. Nothing herein shall be construed as limiting the authority of GCG to initiate renegotiations and/or revoke Performance Agreements in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

3. Project Description:

As stewards of about 52% of the forest cover of the City of Baguio, the Springs Development Project will contribute to further enhancing and preserving the forest and watershed through the sustainable development of the water resources in the John Hay Reservation Area (JHRA).

There are at least four (4) natural springs that will be developed with the establishment of new pumping stations and water distribution lines to augment the water supply of the City of Baguio, the John Hay Special Economic Zone and JHRA.

The existing pumping station (owned by BCDA) is being operated (illegally) by the Camp John Hay Development Corporation (CJHDevco), with two natural springs as sources and providing water supply to the JHSEZ, and at least five (5) barangays in the City of Baguio. The facility has an estimated annual revenue of PHP 18 Million.

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3. Project Description:

JHMC in its pledge to uphold sound Forest, Environment and Watershed Management is committed to the "Continuing Compliance to National Ambient Air Quality Standards on TSP and PM10 within the JHSEZ". This is based on the Implementing Rules and Regulations for RA 8749 otherwise known as the Philippine Clean air Act of 1999. Specifically, the metric would be "Non- exceedance in the standard national value set for Total Suspended Particulates (TSP) and Particulate Matter 10 (PM10)."

Air quality can be measured by air monitoring devices that the DENR - Environmental Management Bureau – CAR can set up within strategic locations in the Camp. However, since the equipment is being used for various other areas (air monitoring stations) for the Cordillera Administrative Region, it is better to either have an EMB-accredited laboratory to measure the ambient air quality or have our own Ambient Air Monitoring and Sampling Device. Parameters that are to be measured are Total Suspended Particulates (TSP) and Particulate Matter 10 (PM₁₀) Specifically, this equipment will be installed in areas identified with infrastructure and those with motor and foot traffic.

It will be a constant challenge to maintain this "GOOD" air quality index through proper Environment, Forest and Watershed Management Practices in comparison to other "airsheds" comparable to Camp John Hay in terms of being an ecozone as well as those areas with similar sources of air pollution which affect the interchange and diffusion of pollution in the surrounding atmosphere.
