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PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT

This Performance Agreement has been executed pursuant to the PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEM FOR THE GOCC SECTOR (GCG MC No. 2013-02 [Re-Issued]) between the -

GOVERNANCE COMMISSION FOR GOCCs (GCG)

- and -

JOHN HAY MANAGEMENT CORPORATION (JHMC)

WITNESSETH: THAT -

The Parties agree to the following terms:

- Period. This Agreement shall be effective beginning from the execution of this Agreement and ending upon the determination by the Governance Commission of the eligibility of JHMC for the FY 2015 PBB and PBI.
- 2. Charter Statement and Strategy Map. - JHMC's Charter Statement and Strategy Map for the Period specified in Section 1 hereof, shall be as follows:

It is understood that the GOCC must achieve a <u>weighted-average of at least 90%</u> to be eligible to grant any Performance-Based Bonus.

- 4. Strategic Initiatives. JHMC hereby commits to undertaking the following key programs and/or projects identified as having a significant impact on its Performance Scorecard (PES Form 2) attached hereto as Annex B, to wit:
 - (a) Strategic Initiative 1 Reconstruction of the Camp John Hay Mini-Hydro Power Plant;
 - (b) Strategic Initiative 2 Amendment to Republic Act 9400;
 - (c) Strategic Initiative 3 Job Fairs in the JHSEZ;
 - (d) Strategic Initiative 4 Springs Development Project: Phase III;
 - (e) Strategic Initiative 5 Preparation of a Forest and Watershed Management and Protection Program (FWMPP);
 - (f) Strategic Initiative 6 Continuing Compliance to National Ambient Air Quality Standards on PM10 within the John Hay Special Economic Zone; and
 - (g) Strategic Initiative 7 Marketing Events to Promote the Historical Core

The Commitment herein includes obtaining all necessary approvals, if applicable, such as those for Major Development Projects under GCG MC No. 2013-03. JHMC shall include updates on the foregoing Strategic Initiatives in its submission of quarterly monitoring reports to the GCG.

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- Quarterly Submission of Performance Monitoring. JHMC shall submit a quarterly monitoring report to the GCG within thirty (30) calendar days from the close of each quarter using the monitoring report attached hereto as Annex C.
- 6. Good Governance Conditions. In addition to the covered portions of the Performance Scorecard, the GOCC must fully comply with the Good Governance Conditions enumerated under GCG MC No. 2013-02 (Re-Issued), GCG MC No. 2014-02, and GCG MC No. 2014-03 namely:
 - 6.1. Conditions Common to National Government Agencies and GOCCs:
 - (a) Transparency Seal;
 - (b) PhilGEPS Posting;
 - (c) Cash Advance Liquidation;
 - (d) Citizen's Charter or its equivalent; and
 - (e) Compliance with the submission and review requirements covering Statement of Assets, Liabilities and Networth (SALN);
 - 6.2. Conditions Specific to GOCCs Covered by R.A. No. 10149:
 - (a) Satisfaction of all statutory liabilities, including the payment of all taxes due to the Government, and declaration and payment of all dividends to the State as of the end of the applicable calendar year, whenever applicable. Liabilities that are still under dispute and there has been no final and executory judgment/decision as of the date of the release of the PBB by the GOCC shall be excluded for the purpose of this provision.
 - (b) Submission and execution of concrete and time bound action plans for addressing Notices of Disallowances and Audit Observation Memoranda from the Commission on Audit (COA), if any.
 - (c) Adoption of a "Manual of Corporate Governance" pursuant to Section 42 of the CODE OF CORPORATE GOVERNANCE FOR GOCCs (GCG MC No. 2012-07) that is approved by GCG and uploaded on the GOCC's website.
 - (d) Compliance with posting on the GOCC's website the information enumerated under Section 43 of GCG MC No. 2012-07.
 - (e) Adoption of a No GIFT POLICY approved by the GCG and uploaded on the GOCC's website pursuant to Section 29 of GCG MC No. 2012-07.
 - (f) Compliance with the deadlines and submission of reports through the Integrated Corporate Reporting System (ICRS) pursuant to GCG MC No. 2014-02.
 - (g) Compliance by all members of the Governing Board with the submission of all required forms for the Director Performance Review (DPR) pursuant to GCG MC. No. 2014-03 and implementing issuances pursuant thereto.
 - (h) Submission of Corporate Operating Budgets (COBs):
 - i. For GOCCs receiving national government budgetary support, COBs shall be submitted to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) for review and approval on or before the deadline indicated in DBM National

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Budget Memorandum No. 120 on "Budget Call for FY 2015;"

- ii. For GOCCs without national government budgetary support, COBs shall be submitted to the Governance Commission using the same deadline as provided in DBM National Budget Memorandum No. 120.
- 7. JHMC hereby undertakes to have its Performance Scorecard rated by its customers and solicit feedback on how the same may be improved. JHMC shall determine the most effective method for accomplishing the said purpose. Such information shall be reported to GCG together with the quarterly monitoring report. The rating shall not affect the performance indicators/measures in JHMC's Performance Scorecard, and shall be used solely as a reference by GCG and JHMC during Performance Agreement Negotiations/Renegotiations.
- 8. JHMC shall timely inform GCG of all audit observations and notices of disallowances within seven (7) working days from the time it receives it receives the same from the Commission on Audit (COA) prior to the regular publication of the final annual audit report. Accordingly, JHMC shall copy furnish the Governance Commission copies of all written communications between JHMC and COA on such matters, inform GCG of the schedule of its exit interview with COA seven (7) working days before the schedule or as soon as practicable, and other efficient means of inter-agency coordination.

Failure to timely disclose such matters to the Governance Commission prior to the same becoming public information or the submission of the application for the Performance-Based Bonus (PBB) or Performance-Based Incentive (PBI) may be considered as non-compliance with the Good Governance Condition of submitting Concrete and Time Bound Action Plans on findings of COA, rendering the Governing Board INELIGIBLE to apply for the PBI, without prejudice to a further determination on the impact of the same on the GOCCs PBB application.

 Nothing herein shall be construed as limiting the authority of GCG to initiate renegotiations and/or revoke Performance Agreements in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

3. Project Description:

The John Hay Mini Hydropower Plant is a run-off river type. It is located within the City of Baguio and the Municipality of Tuba, Benguet Province in a mountainous area of approximately 14 hectares of BCDA property. Its headrace from the intake weir to the power plant has an approximate length of about 2 kilometers. In the past, this power plant had a capacity of 488 kilowatts (KW) until it was severely damaged during the 1990 earthquake.

With the reconstruction of the plant, it is projected to generate between 1.5 to 2.5 megawatts (MW) of clean and renewable energy and will likewise contribute to additional revenue for the government. The conduct of a feasibility study is however necessary prior to the implementation of the project.



3. Project Description:

Camp John Hay has a total land area of 625 hectares, with its forest and watershed areas comprising about 52% of the remaining forest cover of the City of Baguio. Through the years, this natural asset has been providing a myriad of benefits for the City and the neighboring municipalities in the Cordilleras, both economically and environmentally. For one, the good air quality index in the Camp is attributed to the protection and preservation of its dense Benguet Pine forest.

However, in consideration of the effects of climate change, global warming and the rapid growth in population, these have collectively posed imminent threats to the sustainable environment, forest and watersheds

In this regard, the implementation of a Forest and Watershed Management and Protection Program for Camp John Hay that will respond to the present challenges is of paramount importance. The project entails the assessment of the current state of the forest watershed

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and the institution of appropriate interventions to protect and sustain the forest and its environs.

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ADDENDUM

This Addendum has been executed pursuant to the PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEM FOR THE GOCC SECTOR (GCG MC No. 2013-02 [Re-Issued]) between the –

GOVERNANCE COMMISSION FOR GOCCs (GCG)

- and -

JOHN HAY MANAGEMENT CORPORATION (JHMC)

WHEREAS, the Parties above entered into a Performance Agreement covering CY 2014;

WHEREAS, Section 7.2 of GCG MC No. 2013-02 (Re-Issued) provides that "GOCCs can renegotiate the targets set in their Performance Agreements for the current year if the same are no longer feasible <u>due to substantial changes in circumstances that could not have been foreseen at the time the targets were agreed upon."</u>

WHEREAS, the Parties agreed to renegotiate certain targets for CY 2014;

WITNESSETH: THAT -

- 1. JHMC's Performance Scorecard in its 2014 Performance Agreement is hereby amended pursuant to the attached Renegotiated Performance Scorecard.
- 2. All other conditions in the Performance Agreement shall remain effective, without prejudice to the application of future rules and regulations, such as but not limited to:
 - (a) Compliance with the deadlines and submission of reports through the Integrated Corporate Reporting System (ICRS) pursuant to GCG MC No. 2014-02.
 - (b) Compliance by all members of the Governing Board with the submission of all required forms for the Director Performance Review (DPR) pursuant to GCG MC. No. 2014-03 and implementing issuances pursuant thereto.
 - (c) Submission of Corporate Operating Budgets (COBs):
 - For GOCCs receiving national government budgetary support, COBs shall be submitted to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) for review and approval on or before the deadline indicated in DBM National Budget Memorandum No. 120 on "Budget Call for FY 2015;"
 - ii. For GOCCs without national government budgetary support, COBs shall be submitted to the Governance Commission using the same deadline as provided in DBM National Budget Memorandum No. 120.

3. JHMC shall timely inform GCG of all audit observations and notices of disallowances within seven (7) working days from the time it receives it receives the same from the Commission on Audit (COA) prior to the regular publication of the final annual audit report. Accordingly, JHMC shall copy furnish the Governance Commission copies of all written communications between JHMC and COA on such

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nance such matters, inform GCG of the schedule of its exit interview with COA seven (7) working days before the schedule or as soon as practicable, and other efficient means of inter-agency coordination

Failure to timely disclose such matters to the Governance Commission prior to the same becoming public information or the submission of the application for the Performance-Based Bonus (PBB) or Performance-Based Incentive (PBI) may be considered as non-compliance with the Good Governance Condition of submitting Concrete and Time Bound Action Plans on findings of COA, rendering the Governing Board INELIGIBLE to apply for the PBI, without prejudice to a further determination on the impact of the same on the GOCCs PBB application.

 Nothing herein shall be construed as limiting the authority of GCG to initiate renegotiations and/or revoke Performance Agreements in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.


