1. Respond quickly to emergencies, including natural disasters, accidents, and health crises, and other incidents requiring immediate medical attention.
2. Provide first aid and basic life support (BLS) to affected individuals until advanced medical care becomes available.
3. Maintain cleanliness and inventory of emergency equipment, tools, supplies, and clinic; and ensure readiness for deployment and conduct preventive maintenance care of the mounted equipment.
4. Monitor content of medical kit and request and store medical supplies.
5. Participate in health maintenance assessments/examinations and perform nursing tasks within the scope of the nursing profession, and if more extensive examinations are needed, refer to hospital or physician.
6. Participate in the recurring training programs and safety and health inspection activities as required.
7. Participate in the implementation and improvement of occupational safety and health programs by identifying workplace hazards and recommending corrective actions.
8. Document all actions taken during emergency responses, submit incident reports for evaluation and accountability.
9. Maintain accurate reporting and records management systems for trauma and emergency related activities and assistance.
10. Perform additional tasks that may be assigned from time to time in support of emergency preparedness and organizational operations.
